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A stay at Mollies is indeed a rare treat. We stayed for two nights on our way from Australia to the USA and thoroughly enjoyed the property and the hospitality of the owners.

We stayed in one of the lower floor suites that had a separate bedroom and lounge area (Suite 6). Behind the bedroom was a contemporary light filled bathroom.
